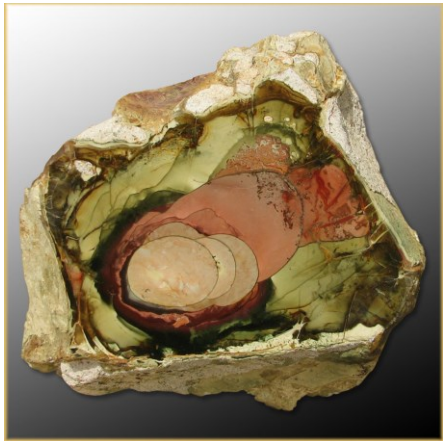

Morrisonite

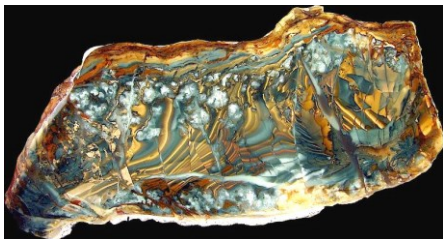
Morrisonite is known in America as “the King of Jaspers”. It is an exquisite, fine-grained Porcelain Jasper with a myriad of colours, patterns, and orbs.

Morrisonite is named after a reclusive gentleman named James Morison, who lived in a one-roomed hut by the Owyhee River in south-eastern Oregon. (The Owyhee Desert, which straddles the border between Idaho and Oregon, is well known for many fine varieties of Jasper).

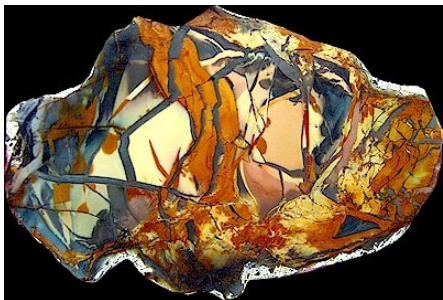
Morison, and the owner of a Boise, Idaho rock shop discovered Morrisonite in 1947. Back then it was selling at \$3 a lb. Recent prices at the Tucson gem & mineral show have exceeded \$400 a lb.!



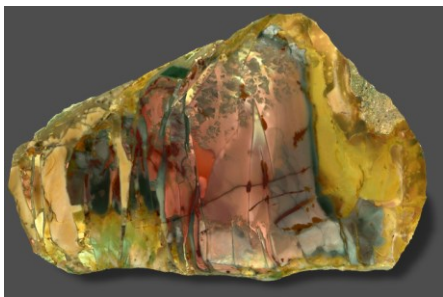

Lapis Lazuli

Lapis Lazuli (usually abbreviated to “Lapis”) is a rock composed primarily of the mineral Lazurite, but also containing Hauyne, Sodalite & Nosean. It is a relatively soft material, with a hardness of 5-6, and a specific gravity of 2.2 – 2.9. The chemical composition is $(Na, Ca)_8(Al, Si)_{12}O_{24}(S, SO_4)$.

Lapis is one of the earliest gem materials to be used in jewellery – examples found in Egypt dating back over 7,000 years.

There are two main world sources of Lapis Lazuli – Afghanistan and Chile.

The Afghani material is generally considered the better grade. Lapis from Afghanistan is a royal blue (the richer the colour, the better the grade) with sprinklings of gold Pyrite (“Fools Gold”) and little or no white/grey Calcite.

Chilean material is a paler blue, usually with inclusions of Calcite and little or no Pyrite. Until recently, the low-grade Chilean material used to be discarded, but today nothing is thrown away. Low grade Chilean Lapis is today either marketed as “Denim” Lapis or dyed a darker blue and marketed as “Indigo” Lapis. The blue of dyed “Indigo” Lapis is markedly different when seen next to the beautiful royal blue of the Afghani material.

Over 90% of all Lapis Lazuli on sites like eBay today is dyed or reconstituted Chilean material, reconstituted meaning the porous, lowest grade material which has been crushed, had glues, hardeners and dyes added, then pressed into blocks from which beads etc. are made.



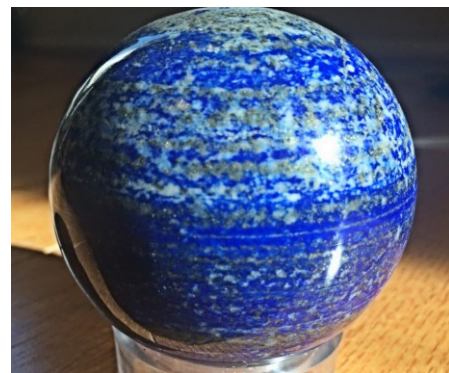

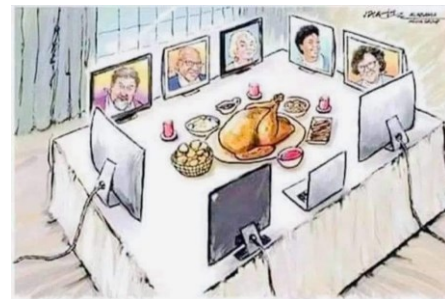
Impacts of Covid CUTE

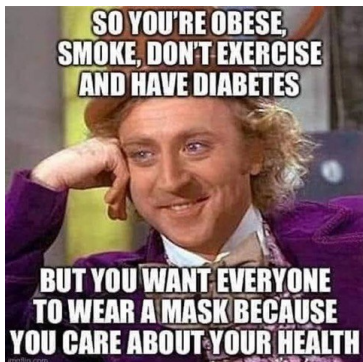

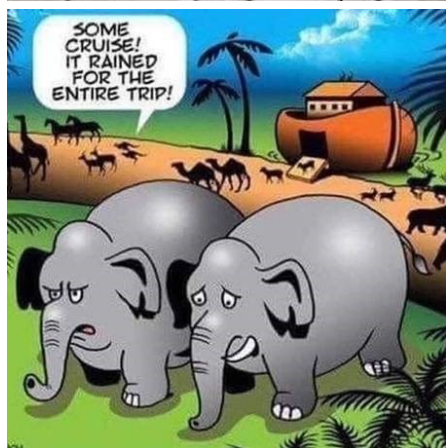

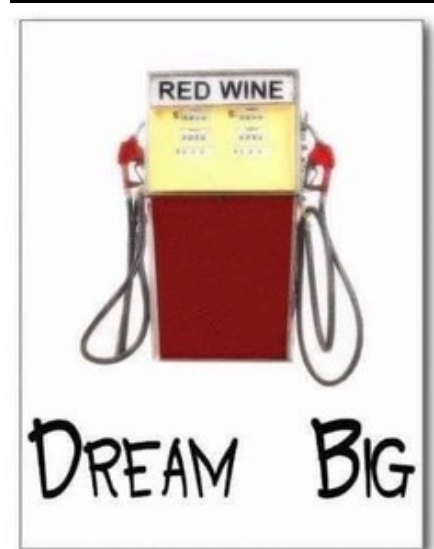
