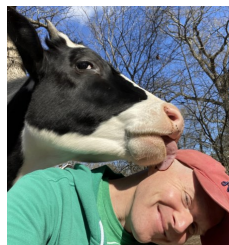

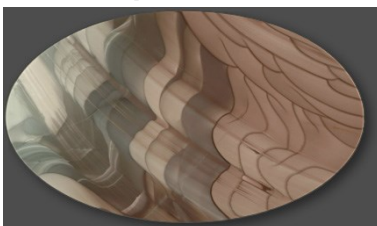

As I have now completed 3 series - on Agates, Jaspers and Birthstones, future articles will be independent ones on various rocks, minerals, gemstones, or allied topics.

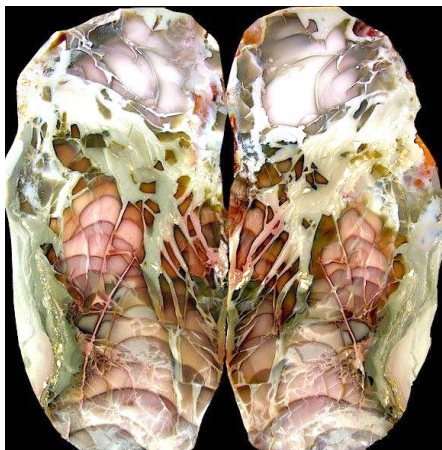

**Willow Creek Jasper**

*Willow Creek* is one of finest porcelain Jaspers in the world. Given the quality of material seen on the Internet, most collectors are not aware of the outstanding qualities of premium material. Willow Creek Jasper is mined 15 miles north of Eagle, Idaho (NW of Boise, Idaho). The Jasper forms in the centre of giant thundereggs and rarely in seams. One of the prevailing theories, as far as Willow Creek goes, is that these thunder eggs formed deep within the earth, then were thrust up through large volcanic vents where they accumulated and solidified surrounded by very hard Rhyolite.

Mining the Thundereggs is very difficult hard rock mining. Dynamite is used to loosen the eggs within the Rhyolite matrix and once loosened, next comes the backhoe and pry bar. Once free, the eggs may only be opened by sledgehammer and wedges.

Willow Creek Jasper is known for its subtle pastel colours, streamer patterns, and egg or orb patterns. Premium quality Willow Creek is unmatched. It takes an extreme high gloss... like liquid glass. People who have worked Willow Creek say it has pastel colours and is somewhat soft and delicate in nature. Perhaps, but top, premium quality Willow Creek has dramatic colouring, and incredible patterning. It is considered the purest porcelain of the porcelain Jaspers. The Willow Creek Mine has been producing Jasper for the past 35+ years but unfortunately mainly low-grade material is available on the open market today.



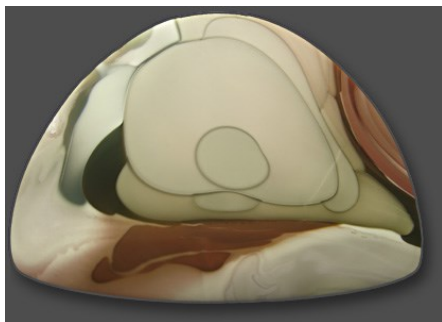

### Fairy Stones

These are unusually shaped objects composed of calcium carbonate and clay or sand.

They are formed when there is an accumulation of seafloor sedimentary mud rock, mineral accretions, and fossilized crystal deposits of plant and animal remains in areas of ancient glacial deposits.

Fairy Stone concretions come in a variety of unusual shapes and irregular ovoid sizes due to the environmental conditions and the composition of sedimentary mineral deposits which created them. Legend has it that the indigenous inhabitants of North America, the Algonquin, first called these unusually shaped minerals "Fairy Stones".

Fairy Stone concretion colour ranges from grey-brown to chalky white. Fairy Stones concretions are mainly found in ancient glacial deposits within Canada, but can also be found in the United States, British Isles, Greenland, Scandinavia, and Morocco.

Quite surprising were the results of the growth rates. Concretions were thought to take hundreds of thousands to millions of years to form. However, they instead apparently grow at a very fast rate over just several months to several years. This new observation could also explain why the fossils found inside the concretions are so well preserved.

### Coffin Bay Safari

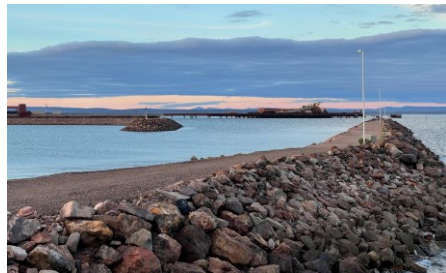
(18-04-2021 – 24-04-2021)

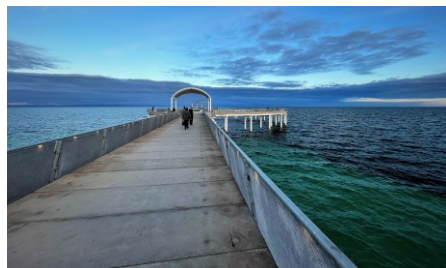

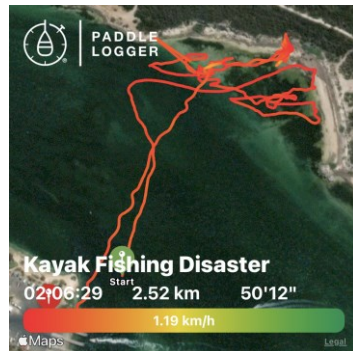
Nine locals (7 here plus 2 more across the road behind me) not too bothered by our presence.

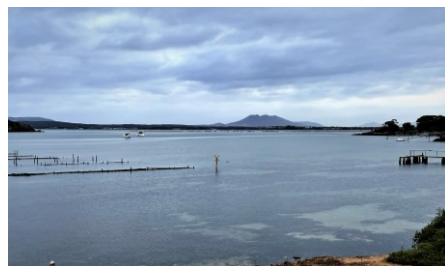
Allen has a Paddle Logger app on his iPhone, and it produced this picture showing the route they took as well as recording their speed and distance travelled.

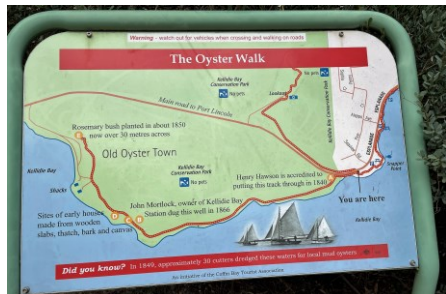
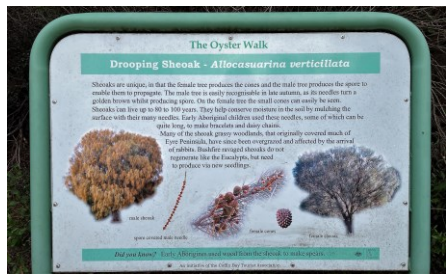
Morning of Day 5: 22-04-2021

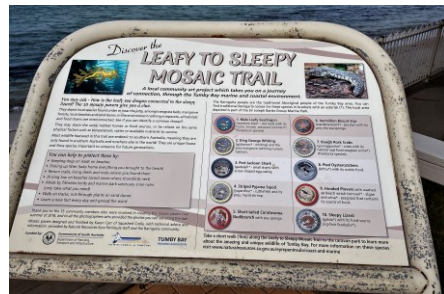
