



In the 1960s/70s, Fowlers Bay was in a significant state of decline following the closure of the school. shipping, and Courthouse/Police Station...and a reduction in inhabitants.

Southern Right Whales - Head of the Bight. The Southern Right Whales come to give birth in the protected bay each year between Mid-May to late October. The Female whales generally breed once every three years and bear calves that are about 5.5 m long and 1000?1500 kg at birth. While most Southern Right Whales are black to dark grey with small ventral patches of white, these animals have extensive areas of white sometimes extending well up the flanks or even onto the back and head. Some calves are even born completely white, developing dark markings later in life. Females feed and nurture their young in the shallows where they can best protect their young from predators such as their Killer Whale cousins or the Great White Shark.



Whales were scattered across the water in both coastal directions and some seen further out to sea as far as visibility allowed. The viewing here from the height of the cliffs offered a significant advantage over viewing from a boat. Boat viewing is also restricted by a regulation that boats must maintain a certain distance from whales.

A Little Bit of Car History

After the bombing of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, the Secret Service found themselves in a bind.

At the time, Federal Law prohibited buying any cars that cost more than \$750, so they would have to get clearance from Congress to do that and nobody had time for that.

One of the Secret Service members, however, discovered that the US Treasury had seized the bulletproof car that mobster Al Capone owned when he was sent to jail in 1931.

They cleaned it, made sure it was running perfectly and had it ready for the President the next day.

Al Capone's 1928 Cadillac V-8 "Al Capone" Town Sedan became the President's Limo in December 1941.



Mechanics are said to have cleaned and checked each feature of the Caddy well into the night of December 7th, to make sure that it would run properly the next day for the Commander in Chief.

And run properly it did. It had been painted black and green to look identical to Chicago's police cars at the time.

To top it off, the gangster's 1928 Cadillac Town Sedan had 3,000 pounds of armour and inchthick bulletproof windows.



It also had a specially installed siren and flashing lights hidden behind the grille, along with a police scanner radio.



When you are young, speed and adrenaline seem to be great.




