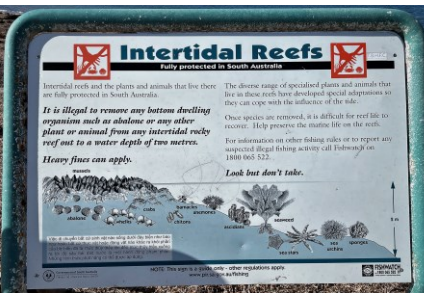
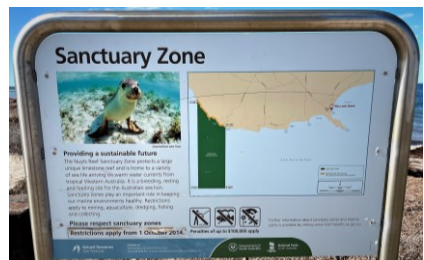


At Ceduna we dined-out at the Foreshore Hotel.

Contributed by Mel Jones... Exploring Fowlers Bay on 14-08-2021 continued... 'Fowlers Bay Historic Walk' Historic interpretive signage erected around the town...

1 The Indigenous People. The Indigenous people of Fowlers Bay were the Ngarrindjeri. They were a part of the larger Ngarrindjeri Nation who lived along the coast from the mouth of the River Murray to the Fleurieu Peninsula.

2 Sea Exploration. 1622 Thomas Hayes' Ship. The first visit to Fowlers Bay was made in 1622 by Dutch Captain Thomas Hayes. He was on a voyage to the East Indies and was blown off course by a storm.

3 The Whaling Industry 1840-1844. In 1840, the whaling industry was in its prime. Fowlers Bay was a major whaling station. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

4 Yatala & The Fowlers Bay Run. 1852 James' Whaling Station. The whaling industry was a major part of Fowlers Bay's economy. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

5 The Fowlers Bay Run Yatala Station. The Fowlers Bay Run was a major part of the whaling industry. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

6 Land Exploration. 1811 Richard Webb's Expedition. In 1811, Richard Webb led an expedition to explore the area around Fowlers Bay. He was looking for a route to the interior of the continent.

7 Police Station 1883 & Court House 1912. 1883 Police Station. The Police Station was built in 1883. It was a two-story building with a central tower. It was used for the police and the court.

8 Shipping - Port Eyre, Fowlers Bay. The shipping industry was a major part of Fowlers Bay's economy. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

9 Harbour Facilities Port Eyre. The harbour facilities at Port Eyre were a major part of the whaling industry. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

13 Matthew Flinders - 1802. In 1802, Matthew Flinders led an expedition to explore the area around Fowlers Bay. He was looking for a route to the interior of the continent.

14 W. J. Betts Ltd General Store. The General Store was built in 1883. It was a two-story building with a central tower. It was used for the general store and the court.

15 Post & Telegraph Office. The Post & Telegraph Office was built in 1883. It was a two-story building with a central tower. It was used for the post and the telegraph.

16 Globe Hotel 1892 - 1936. The Globe Hotel was built in 1892. It was a two-story building with a central tower. It was used for the hotel and the court.

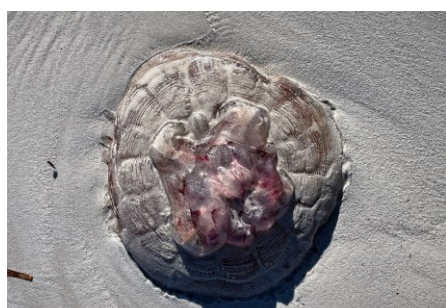
17 Kent Town & High Street. The Kent Town & High Street was a major part of the whaling industry. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

18 New Terrace & Swan Street. The New Terrace & Swan Street was a major part of the whaling industry. The whaling ships would come to Fowlers Bay to refuel and to have their crews and supplies replenished.

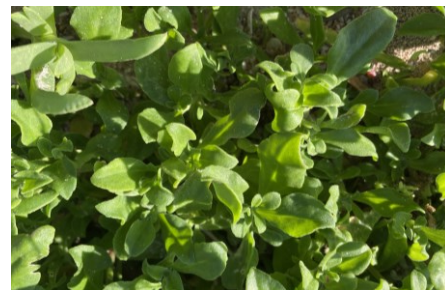

Back in 1974, when on the way to Perth, we camped overnight at Fowlers Bay next to the back of the deserted, former Court House/Police Station (shown restored above as an accommodation service). And we setup a canvas shower bucket to wash in the morning at the back of the building next to the gaol pictured below.

In the 1960s/70s, Fowlers Bay was in a significant state of decline following the closure of the school, shipping, and Courthouse/Police Station...and a reduction in inhabitants.



Since then, Fowlers Bay has picked up and maintains a pleasant small-town atmosphere very much worth a stopover for relaxation if not for fishing and/or whale watching.

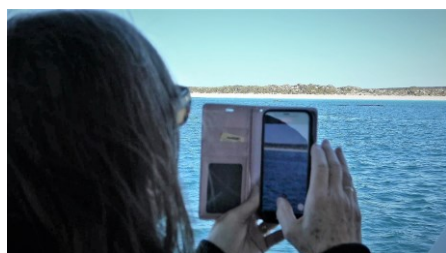

On 16-08-2021, Janet and I joined fellow tourists at the **Head of the Bight Whale Watching Visitors Centre** at Yalata, South Australia.



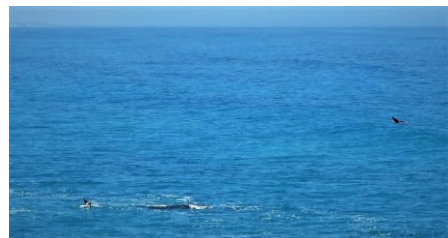

Southern Right Whales – Head of the Bight.
 The Southern Right Whales come to give birth in the protected bay each year between Mid-May to late October. The Female whales generally breed once every three years and bear calves that are about 5.5 m long and 1000?1500 kg at birth. While most Southern Right Whales are black to dark grey with small ventral patches of white, these animals have extensive areas of white sometimes extending well up the flanks or even onto the back and head. Some calves are even born completely white, developing dark markings later in life. Females feed and nurture their young in the shallows where they can best protect their young from predators such as their Killer Whale cousins or the Great White Shark.



Whales were scattered across the water in both coastal directions and some seen further out to sea as far as visibility allowed. The viewing here from the height of the cliffs offered a significant advantage over viewing from a boat. Boat viewing is also restricted by a regulation that boats must maintain a certain distance from whales.

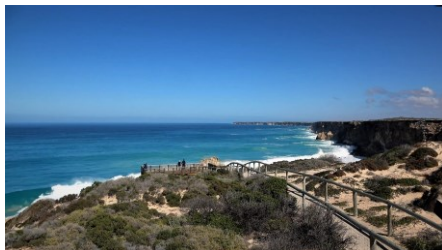

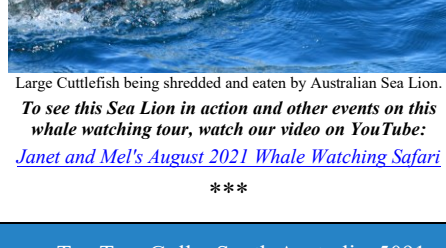
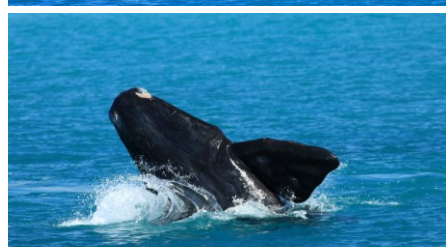

A Little Bit of Car History

After the bombing of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, the Secret Service found themselves in a bind.

Al Capone's 1928 Cadillac V-8 "Al Capone" Town Sedan became the President's Limo in December 1941.



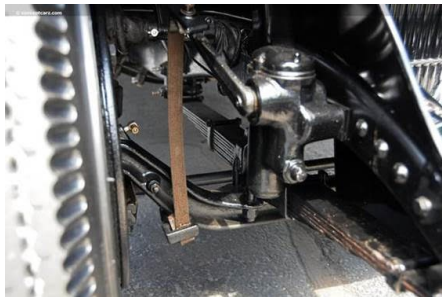
Mechanics are said to have cleaned and checked each feature of the Caddy well into the night of December 7th, to make sure that it would run properly the next day for the Commander in Chief.
